Pro-car message	Gil exclaims, "Is this an old Peugeot?!" when the car that transports him to the 1920s first appears. He notes that a friend of his collects cars.	- 2
Negative portrayals of/comments on non-automotive transportation	Inez and her mother disparage walking in the city, especially when it's raining. Inez's father hires a detective to follow Gil during his "suspicious" walks around the city.	- 4
Negative portrayal of /comments on automobile transportation	The mother of the bride-to-be complains: "In this traffic nothing moves," highlighting how cars clog cities.	+ 2
Positive portrayals of /comments on alternative transportation	Walking through a city is portrayed as being full of creative potential. The opening montage includes buses and bicyclists, pedestrians filling crosswalks and sidewalks; also shows the city's bike share program.	+ 4
